In order to register, an assessment of compliance needs to be completed and submitted on the RSPH portal. Enquiries with NHS Digital on how they should proceed resulted in the following reply:-</p> <p><i>The next step now for pharmacies that have missed face to face training session is to wait for further guidance on the business as usual (BAU) process. We are hoping to provide details on what this process will be in the next few weeks.</i></p> <p><i>The earliest now that these pharmacies can request SCR access will be from the 1st of April onwards. 		<p><u>(RA) agents for the addition of SCR role based access codes to smartcards for users of SCR and Privacy Officers, NHS Digital require all requested details, as detailed at the face to face events, to be submitted by 28 February 2017.</u></p> <p>Failure to meet this deadline will mean there can be no guarantee that RA actions can be completed in time for contractors to access SCR and, therefore trigger the £200 one-off activation payment ahead of the payment cut-off date of 31 March 2017.</p> <p>Your LPC is already working with contractors to move them forward with getting live with SCR not only to receive the tariff payment but also to support the quality payment criteria. Those pharmacies who still need to complete the request to the Registration Authority (RA) agents for addition of the SCR role based access codes to smart cards for users of SCR and Privacy Officers will received a separate email direct to their pharmacy from the LPC marked <u>'Urgent Action Required: SCR access codes for Smart Cards'</u>.</p> <p>Those pharmacies who have not been recorded as attending one of the face to face training session provided by MLCS or NHS Digital during 2016/17 will also receive a separate email from the LPC marked: <u>'SCR - no record of attendance at face to face training'</u>. 	<p>9.4 NHS Urgent Medication Supply Advanced Service (NUMSAS)</p> <p><u>ACTION REQUIRED: NHS Urgent Medicine Supply Advanced Service Pilot</u></p> <p>From 1st December 2016, community pharmacies across England have been registering with NHS England to provide the NHS Urgent Medicine Supply Advanced Service (NUMSAS). The service will allow community pharmacies to supply a repeat medicine following referral from NHS111.</p> <p>Requests for medicines needed urgently account for around 2% of all completed NHS111 calls. These calls usually default to a GP Out of Hours appointment to arrange an urgent prescription and as a result, block access to GP appointments.</p> <p>This service is not intended to replace the usual care a patient would receive from their GP and pharmacist and it will not be advertised directly to the public. The service is being piloted nationally to evaluate the impact on the urgent care system in order to inform future commissioning.</p> <p>A meeting is currently being arranged on our patch with local stakeholders to discuss the mobilisation of this service by the end of March 2017. 		<p>PSNC Briefing 010/17: Updated NHS Identity Guidelines – NHS logo use by pharmacies (February 2017)</p> <p>The single NHS identity was introduced in England in 1999 to signpost people to NHS organisations and services and to help them identify information which has come from an official NHS source. The NHS logo is now instantly recognised and its application directly affects how patients and the public think and feel about the NHS.</p> <p>In 2004, the Department of Health issued guidance on how pharmacies could use the logo and since then contractors have been encouraged to make appropriate use of the NHS identity in line with the guidance.</p> <p>In January 2017 NHS England updated the guidelines on the use of the NHS Identity, including revised guidance for all primary care contractors who are commissioned under a primary care contract. See agenda item 8.1.4		PSNC Briefing 011/17: Healthy Living Pharmacy – Holding a health promotion event/campaign (February 2017) This PSNC Briefing provides guidance for community pharmacy contractors and their teams on holding a health promotion event/campaign. To achieve and to maintain Healthy Living Pharmacy (HLP) level 1 status as defined by Public Health England’s quality criteria , pharmacy teams are required to meet 27 quality criteria and are required to demonstrate how they meet these. Holding health promotion events/campaigns and documenting details of these are a way for pharmacy teams to demonstrate that they meet several of these criteria.
