
# CPPE Programmes and resources Autumn/ Winter 2024

This programme aims to develop the knowledge, clinical skills and behaviours of pharmacy technicians working Health and Justice sector and Community Pharmacy to increase patient access to clinical services by widening the skill mix in pharmacy teams. The programme is made up of the following main components:

- Self-directed e-course comprised of six modules
- Learning needs analysis (LNA) and an initial meeting with an education supervisor to discuss learning needs and create an action plan
- Clinical assessment skills face to face workshop
- Workplace practice of clinical assessment skills
- Online two-hour workshop to support reflective practice
- Optional peer support sessions, which provide opportunities to develop professional network and establish support networks
- Approximately 4-6 hours of learning per week

- improve leadership skills to direct the dispensary team
- support the multi-disciplinary team to deliver patient-facing services.

# Newly qualified pharmacist programme

The overall aim of the *Newly qualified pharmacist* programme is to support newly qualified pharmacists to develop, and demonstrate, confidence and competence in core areas of pharmacy practice. The programme is designed to support pharmacists to become better equipped to adapt and deliver safe and effective patient care and overcome the challenges of this new stage of their career.

The 12-month programme, fully funded by NHS England (NHSE) as part of their Newly Qualified Pharmacist pathway, takes a blended learning approach, offering a mix of online learning, workshops, assessment and work-based support through a designated CPPE education supervisor.

## Leading for change

This online tutor supported <u>Leading for change</u> programme is delivered over 6 months and is open to Pharmacy professionals who have responsibility for leading a team or services within their organization.

The programme will enable participants to develop behaviours required to become and inspiring and effective pharmacy leader with the knowledge and skills to deiliver better outcomes for patients and service users.

The Autum cohorts for this programme are now full, applications for Spring 2025 will open in February 2025. The online course is delivered over 4 modules on Canvas and is complemented by 4 compulsory workshops.

Cohort 3 begins on 31<sup>st</sup> March with workshops on Tuesday afternoons 8<sup>th</sup> April, 13<sup>th</sup> may, 17<sup>th</sup> June and 22<sup>nd</sup> July.

It offers a comprehensive mix of residential workshops, optional online specialist study days, and small group support to build capability, confidence and networks across the wider system.
